What is Pupil Premium?

- A Government grant that forms part of the school budget.
- An amount per pupil is allocated each year.
- It is 'ring fenced', meaning it has to be used for the specific purpose identified.
- It has to be used to raise the attainment of groups of pupils who may be disadvantaged .This consists of low income families, looked after children, and children whose parents are in the armed forces.

Impact of Pupil Premium

- School data shows that all disadvantaged pupils at the school made at least expected progress with many making more than expected progress in reading and writing.
- School data shows that 2/3 Year 6 disadvantaged pupils made expected progress in maths
- The vast majority of children from Reception to Year 6 who are disadvantaged achieved at or above national expectations in English and Maths.
