

### What is Pupil Premium?

- A Government grant that forms part of the school budget.
- An amount per pupil is allocated each year.
- It is 'ring fenced', meaning it has to be used for the specific purpose identified.
- It has to be used to raise the attainment of groups of pupils who may be disadvantaged .*This consists of low income families, looked after children, and children whose parents are in the armed forces.*

**KEY AIM : To address any underlying inequalities between children so that we ...**

- *fulfil our vision  
for all children to be successful learners who achieve their personal best  
for each child to feel valued and included  
for children to become confident in their self- esteem and capacity to learn*
- *narrow gaps in achievement by enabling disadvantaged children to achieve as well as their peers, ensuring specific supported programmes are implemented and professional development undertaken to enable quality provision for children requiring intervention.*
- *To ensure all children are provided with a range of extra curriculum and enrichment activities.*
