

### What is Pupil Premium?

- A Government grant that forms part of the school budget.
- An amount per pupil is allocated each year.
- It is 'ring fenced', meaning it has to be used for the specific purpose identified.
- It has to be used to raise the attainment of groups of pupils who may be disadvantaged . *This consists of low income families, looked after children, and children whose parents are in the armed forces.*

### Aims and Objectives in allocation of Pupil Premium

**KEY AIM : To address any underlying inequalities between children so that we ...**

- *fulfil our vision  
for all children to be successful learners who achieve their personal best  
for each child to feel valued and included  
for children to become confident in their self- esteem and capacity to learn*
- *narrow gaps in achievement by enabling disadvantaged children to achieve as well as their peers. Ensuring, where required, specific supported programmes are implemented and professional development undertaken to enable quality provision for disadvantaged children requiring intervention.*
- *To ensure all children are provided with a range of extra curriculum and enrichment activities.*

Additional classroom support; Additional TA support in KS2 classes (£ 15,800 ) Staff training : reading ( £1000) Pastoral support service ( £1,500)
Curriculum enrichment : ks1 and Ks2 access to learning a musical instrument : £2,900 YR music 10 weeks ( £350)

### Reading

4/6 achieved the expected standard: 2 pupils were just below the expected standard scored upper 90s

Progress: 3 of the PP pupils were high attaining in Y2( L3 at KS1). These did not achieve the higher level at Ks2 in reading, which has affected the progress scores for Reading for PP

### Maths

In y6 maths only 1 pupil did not achieve the expected standard ( gaining a standardised score of 99 and being one mark off the threshold)

### Writing

1 pupil did not achieve the expected standard

### GPS

3/6 PP did not achieve the standard. 2 of these pupils scored 98/99

During the tests, one of the PP was particularly and visibly affected by the tests and is unlikely to have performed to her ability.
