Welcome back for the last term of this academic year, I cannot believe how quickly this year is going.

We will be are starting our new term with a new topic of course, and this term is 'Vikings on Tour'. You will be aware that we looked briefly at the Vikings in the Autumn term but this term will we be extending our knowledge of them by focusing on their influence in the Scandinavian countries and what these countries are like.
