As artists we will be creating 2D art work using paint and collage materials to create flames. We will also be creating houses using different media for The Great Fire of London. Our 3D work will include making dragons by folding paper and through using clay. We will also be exploring how Samuel Pepys wrote using a quill.

As scientists we will be finding out about melting through experiments and cooking.

We will be talking about how to keep safe around fire. We will be thinking about different types of materials.

As mathematicians we will be counting up to 100 (Y1) and beyond (Y2). We will be adding and subtracting using a range of strategies: practical based (Y1) and focussing on 100 squares and empty number lines (Y2). We will also be measuring with non- standard units (Y1)

In PE we will be developing a range of multi- skills and games and creating our own dances.

As Historians we will be looking at how fire has been used to light houses and to cook with through the last 100 years. We will also be finding out about The Great Fire of London through the diaries of Samuel Pepys. We will be looking at the differences between fire engines now and in the past.
