SATs testing is now completed ...we were very impressed by the Year 6 children's calmness and commitment to do their very best. The national tests for both Year 2 and Year 6 are very challenging and so it is a 'well done' to the children in Oak and Willow class that they worked hard under what have to be 'exam conditions.' As with every year, we ensure that Year 6 are well prepared, and that as much as possible, the children are not made to feel under any pressure – especially in Year 2 where we ensured that the children were not even aware they were being tested.

Year 1 children will have their statutory National phonics assessment after half term, during the week beginning 11 June.

Next half term is extremely busy, with a whole range of activities planned, especially around our topics, including our 'Round the World Day' music and dance from around the world, and a Buddhist visitor to Oak class. Sports Week will also include lots of activity. Please keep the diary dates handy, and keep a check on book bags/ website for information so that children have what they need for the events and activities.

FOLS Film Club – Following on from the success of the last film club event, FOLS are running a further two next half term for both KS1 (Willow class) and KS2 (Willow and Oak). This term we prepare to welcome our new Reception children. Reception class teachers will be visiting the Nursery. The children will then have visits to school and their new class. This will ensure they are familiar with their new surroundings and well prepared for their 1st day at 'big school'! Parents are also invited to attend the Activity Day and Welcome Meeting. All children have the option of starting full time from September. As always, we will have a gradual start in the first few days for new Reception children.

Our Year 6 pupils will also be prepared for their next step with a visit to Reepham High School for two days on the 11th and 12th July. We are also hosting an informal meeting about starting High School for parents and children on 21 June at 6pm.

All other children in the school will have their school moving up day on July 11th, where the children will spend the day in their new year groups with their new class, with some children also moving classroom and having a new teacher! New Reception children will join us for the morning.
