



Church School Inspection

Our church school inspection report has now been published following the inspector's visit before the Easter break. The school has been judged good in all aspects of the inspection. He spent time visiting classes, break and lunchtimes, talking to children throughout the day. We are delighted that he confirmed we are a good school, and highly praised the ethos of our school finding many strengths, including

'pupils' behaviour is excellent and the highly positive relationships between all in the school community are based on mutual respect.'

'pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural understanding is highly developed, regardless of ability, background or faith of each pupil'.

'pupils ...are socially aware, going out of their way to be helpful to all and having great pride in their school'.

'levels of attendance are high as pupils say they enjoy coming to school.'

All this follows our successful Ofsted inspection last term, in which our school was also rated good.

As a school community, we should be very proud of our school, and all the support from everyone within it – families, staff, governors, and of course the children, that make our 'school family' the unique and wonderful place that it is for our children in which to 'grow, learn and achieve together'.

Parent survey

We had 35 replies from the survey distributed at parents' evenings. The responses were overwhelmingly positive, although communication about events was considered poor by a few parents. We will therefore aim to ensure that information is on our newsletters (paper and online) and school website on the upcoming events section for parents who can't regularly come into school. We would hope that parents could check on these rather than have text reminders – as this method adds to the school costs, so we would prefer to use texting for urgent messages to parents. School Meals survey. This survey was organised by the School Council and we had 33 replies. There were a range of comments from parents. The Universal Free meals programme is clearly valued by parents of our younger children. Some parents were not aware of the range available such as packed lunches for Rowan and Oak pupils. For parents of older children, many considered that portions were too small.

As a result of the survey, our caterers Norse) are looking to increase the portion size for Oak pupils with immediate effect. They are also going to hold a Parents' Taster and Information meeting. This will be on Friday 18th May at 2.15pm.

Tests in school

May is the busy month for tests. National Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs) are taking place for Year 2 and Year 6 children. The national dates set for Year 6 SATS is the week of May 14th In June, Year 1 pupils take a National phonics test.
