

Overview: Maths : Measuring weight using non- standard then standard units

Maths	Monday	<p>Look around your house or garden and carefully find something which is <b>heavy</b> -don't choose anything too heavy! Now can you find something which is <b>light</b>?</p> <p>Watch <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=P_XA7MiH0ak">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=P_XA7MiH0ak</a>                  Now talk about the things you have found using the words <b>heavier than, heaviest, lighter than, lightest, heavy as</b>  <i>Additional challenge: find at least 3 different things and order them from heaviest to lightest just by holding them.</i></p>
	Tuesday	<p>Yesterday you used your hands to work out weight. Today have a go at making your own balance scales so that you can measure a little more accurately!  <a href="https://www.wikihow.com/Make-a-Balance-Scale-for-Kids">https://www.wikihow.com/Make-a-Balance-Scale-for-Kids</a>                  (alternatively move onto Wednesday)                  Once you have made them choose a unit of measurement e.g. Lego bricks. Select something to weigh and put that in one cup (don't choose anything too heavy!). Next add something e.g. Lego bricks into the opposite cup until the scales are balanced, How many Lego bricks was it?  <i>Additional challenge: record some of the things you have weighed.</i></p>
	Wednesday	<p>Everything can be weighed more accurately by using standard units of measurement called grams and kilograms. Ask a grown up to show you some kitchen weighing scales. With their help choose some things to weigh e.g. an apple.</p> <p>Now select a recipe with your grown up that you could try out. It's up to your grown up to say which recipe because not everybody has the same ingredients at the moment!                  Read the recipe and talk about the measurements.</p>
	Thursday	<p>Try out your recipe. Did you like it? What would you have changed? Take a photo if you can.  <i>Challenge: write out your recipe to share with a friend or send it to me via our Willow email.</i></p>

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English <b>**Please also encourage your child to read daily</b>	Monday	Re -read the story 'Sidney the Spider' (pages 3-4 of your pack from last week). Talk about the story by sequencing events in the right order. Complete sheet on page 9 <i>Additional challenge: use a dictionary to find other words from the story.</i>
	Tuesday	Read and then sing 'Incy, Wincy Spider' on page 10. You might like to watch this <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MBxeKG7_Hq4">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MBxeKG7_Hq4</a> Sing again and make up some fun actions to go with it!
	Wednesday	Read the letter on page 10. Talk to a grown up about where the capital letters and full stops should go. You may be able to print the page off and add them in. <i>Additional challenge: copy the letter out and add the capital letters and full stops in your best handwriting.</i>
	Thursday	Think about some sentences you could write about a spider. Remember to THINK IT, SAY IT and then WRITE IT e.g. The spider went up the spout. A spider has eight legs. Finally CHECK IT, have you got a capital letter at the start of a sentence? Have you got a full stop at the end of each idea?

Phonics	Monday	Recap <b>igh</b> sound. The igh sound can also be made by using the digraph <b>ie</b> Watch <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=esc6yoAU5yU">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=esc6yoAU5yU</a>
	Tuesday	Some words are spelt using the i-e sound (the <b>i</b> is in the middle and the <b>e</b> is at the end of the word- this is called a <b>split digraph</b> ). Can you find all the <b>i-e</b> words on the postcard below? Maybe you could highlight them or draw a ring around them.
	Wednesday	The igh sound can also be made by <b>y</b> at the end of the word e.g sky. Now try and remember all that you have learnt by spelling the words on the sheet below. Print off if you can or write the words on a piece of paper. Then check using the answers!
	Thursday	spelling practice - recap some of the words you have learnt already (see spelling box below)


