This has been a very different start to the term to the one we were all expecting! We hope you are all keeping safe and well.

To start, all staff want to say a huge well done to all parents and carers, and children, who are adapting to and managing the challenge of home learning.

We know that this is not easy,

especially for those parents/ carers who are juggling the balance of supporting more than one child, or work and other commitments, or all of these. You are doing a tremendous job!

We have sought to make the daily lessons as accessible and flexible as possible for everyone. We recognise that not everyone has the same access to devices or is able to follow set times for activities. Hopefully you will have seen how staff have built on previous experience from the first closures in the summer to enhance what we are offering, in line with expectations. Whilst the 'live on line' element remains a challenge for us and families with limited access, we are providing pre- recorded links from other providers to provide 'teaching' elements of a lesson, to allow parents access at a time that works for them. We will introduce 'live' sessions to allow a form of connection with classes, as we know that is what children really miss during these times.



Our suggested timetables are only a guide to creating a routine, which is important when there isn't the routine and structure of coming to school each day. Please create a routine that works best for your family – no family will be the same or have the same set of circumstances to work round.

Most families and teachers are keeping in touch through the class email, or Tapestry by sending work and news and responding to work and providing feedback.

Staff will respond as soon as they are able. They are working their normal hours, either in school or remotely. All have in- school teaching for pupils who are in school and on these days, replies may take a little longer.

If we don't hear from you, staff will make contact to see how things are going, either by email or phone.

Children's work

Class teachers have been receiving children's work, sent via the class email or Tapestry. We are impressed with what we have seen and the continuing efforts from children to keep up with their learning.

We also ask that you keep your child's work, so that it can be brought to school once we reopen.

We provide books for this, so please come and collect from school if you don't have one.

Gold Book children – We have been so impressed with all your efforts, that we will be continuing with our Gold Book awards each week. These will be for a particular effort with learning or achievement with a piece of work or activity. We are also looking out for those of you staying active indoors and out! Certificates will arrive by email.

Reading

We can provide reading books for your child if required.

These can be collected and exchanged once a week, from school.

Returned books will be quarantined until they can be put back into circulation.
