
1. Read a book every day. Can be one of your school books/a book from home/a book from Oxford Owls website. <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/>
2. Lay out all the flashcards on the table of all the sounds. You say a sound, and your child splats it as quickly as possible. (qu,sh,ch,th,ng,ai,ee,igh,oa,oo,ar,or,ur,ow,oi,ear,air,ure,er)

Play picnic on pluto with the phase 3 graphemes.

You show your child the picture, and they use their flicky fingers to segment it and write it down. Hide the word from them until they are finished, encouraging them to do this as independently as possible. Show them the word once they have finished writing, and see if it's the same.</p> <p>5. Tricky word of the week – all Put your tricky words up somewhere on the wall outside/inside. You could practice throwing a bean bag/ball at them and saying the ones you hit, or you could spray them with a water bottle/nerf gun. 


How to make a paper lantern:

1. Cut off one end of the paper. Set aside to use as the handle.
2. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens, paint or glitter.
3. Fold your paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
4. Cut the marked lines along the sheet. (Do not cut to the edge of the paper).
5. Unfold the paper.
6. Match the long edges together on the lantern and use tape to hold it in place.
7. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.
