Covid update

There is a confirmed case this week from Bawdeswell Primary school, this was an asymptomatic case picked up through testing. Please continue to support us in maintaining the measures we have in place at the beginning and end of the school day, and government guidance out of school.

Schools have received no further guidance or 'road map' on a gradual return to normality from the government. So, schools do not yet know what to expect when there is the planned relaxing of all rules from June 21st. We have been looking at how we can at least continue to create a sense of normality in bringing our children together after half term, whilst keeping our risk reduction in place. We are provisionally planning events that will enable us to share in activities such as a Make Music Day, annual Sports and Leavers assembly.

We will also be having a Move Up day, and transition activities for our new Reception pupils.
