

# NEWSLETTER December 2021



We are well into the term, and still feeling the continuing effects of the covid pandemic. We are not able yet to return to the normality we were hoping for at the start of term.

As everyone knows, this has not gone away and we all should still follow the national guidance as well as take personal measures to protect ourselves and others.

We have had a small number of confirmed cases in school, and are informing parents of children who are in classes where cases have occurred.

Lateral Flow tests can be a good way to identify cases and so reduce the spread. Regular testing is undertaken with high school pupils, and adults can also access regular testing.

The symptom checker is on the school website as a reminder outlining the steps to take, if your child has symptoms of coronavirus. Any child with symptoms must not come to school.

We want to express our huge thanks to staff, pupils and families for all the efforts they are making, around school and in daily life, to ensure that everyone is kept safe and well as far as possibly can be.

We continue to keep separate class groups for most activities, including key stages for lunchtimes and break times, and have 'virtual collective worship assemblies' during the week - It's become too cold for outside get togethers!

Hand hygiene, ventilation and continued additional cleaning during the school day are also in place.

The weather has turned much colder recently. Please ensure your child is suitably dressed for cold conditions, and has a warm named coat. Hats and gloves should also be named so they can be returned promptly if they are misplaced.

We are going outside for playtimes and lunch breaks unless it is raining.

PE for Oak on Monday, Willow on Wednesdays and Rowan on Thursdays also take place outside, as well as sports clubs, so additional layers will be needed.

We have to keep rooms in school regularly ventilated and most of the time doors are opened at break, lunchtime and whenever the class goes outside. We are doing our best to keep everyone warm, but we have a balancing act to ensure adequate ventilation and thermal comfort!

There will be times when windows and doors have to be opened and this can make the room feel chilly. Providing warmer layers such as long socks/ tights, vests etc can help if your child feels the cold.
