Covid update

From 1 April, the government is removing the remaining restrictions. This is due to a move towards 'Living with Covid'.

There are key messages for parents from the Department for Education (DfE)

'Should my child still go to their childcare or education setting if they test positive for Covid?'

*No. From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. **For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days.***

'Will my child's school or college still be taking measures to prevent Covid?'

All settings should have in place baseline infection prevention and control measures that will help to manage the spread of infection:

Ensuring all eligible groups are enabled and supported to take up the offer of national vaccination programmes including COVID-19 and flu.

Ensuring occupied spaces are well-ventilated and let fresh air in.

Reinforcing good hygiene practices such as hand washing and cleaning.'

After the Easter holiday...

Morning Drop Off. We ask that all children continue to be dropped off 8.45 -8.55am at the main gate.

They will continue to go straight into class. Rowan class pupils will enter via the black side gate next to the bike shelter. One adult will be on duty at the gate, and this will be closed at 8.55am. Please ensure your child arrives in plenty of time, to help them feel ready for the start of the school day.

After school pick up. We ask all parents/ carers collecting to come into school via the black side gate.

Cherry class and Rowan class parents can wait on the playground. Cherry will exit from their class door, and Rowan from the main playground door (as they used to pre pandemic).
