Florence Nightingale, a leader of nurses during the Crimean War, spent many hours in the wards treating patients. During her night rounds she gave personal care to the wounded and she established her image as the "Lady with the Lamp" whose light shone brightly for her many patients. We feel this name reflects a key historical figure who was an advocate for mental health education. There is also a connection between Lyng and Florence Nightingale. A young soldier who had fought in the Battle of Balaclava and had been nursed by her, lived in Balaclava Cottage in Lyng.
