Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of The Nightingale Federation,

It has been an absolute delight to spend time in classes over the last two weeks at both schools and observe our pupils learning. The sequence of learning across school is excellent. CHERRY CLASS

One of the class challenges this week was to build a bridge for the Billy Goat to cross over the water using the resources in class. We had some great team work with children taping lollipop sticks together to make a bridge. Some other ideas were using play dough, pipe cleaners, straws, and duplo bricks. We have also helped the goats cross a bridge by rolling the dice and reading the words on the rocks, improving our speedy reading and turn taking skills.

Willow class have really enjoyed their new topic of 'Planet Earth' we have had some fabulous homework creations looking at the different animals which live on different continents, flags and even models of the Earth!

This week in Rowan Class we have been using drama to explore the rainforest. Taking turns to be the interviewer and the explorer and using our knowledge of the rainforest and the rich vocabulary to describe an image in the explorer's mind.

In science we are investigating why plants have stems and using celery sticks to help us understand how water and nutrients are transported from the roots to the rest of the plant in vessels.

Also in RE, we have been exploring Christian Bible teachings in small groups, which relate to compassion.
