## Maths learning objectives:

In the lead up to SATS, Year 6 will be having regular arithmetic practise and revising priority areas of the maths curriculum. Year 5 will be securing fundamental areas of their maths curriculum before reuniting with Year 6 in the final week.

# This half term's learning:

This half term, we start a new topic:

#### Mapping the World

This means our topic focus this half term will be Geography

Our 6-week geography topic introduces and explores different maps and how we use them. It also introduces our fieldwork unit for the year where the children will plan, carry out and present their geographical studies in our local area. The following question s make up the different lessons:

- What can maps tell us about the world?
  - How can you locate places on a map?
- How do you read an Ordnance Survey (OS) map?
  - Can you plan fieldwork?
  - Can you carry out fieldwork?
- Can you present your fieldwork findings?





#### Other curriculum areas:

In **Science**, we will begin our new topic of Electricity, understanding how we use and generate it before getting hands on with circuits!

In  $\mathbf{DT}$ , the children will be testing their flood-proof houses from our last topic.

In **PE**, we will be trying our hand at cricket and learning fundamental movement skills in Real PE.

Music we will be rehearsing our contribution to the music event at the Royal Norfolk Show.

Forest school will continue with Miss Dutson on a Monday where the children will continue to learn skills and be creative in our outdoor environment. In Geography, our geographical study of the local area (Lyng) will see us go out explore how the village uses its space and how it has changed over time.
